The age of social media has brought people together in a way never before seen by society, and when a loved one passes, a social media platform such as Facebook is beneficial in the grieving process.

Most social media platforms utilize hashtags to organize user's content. Memorial hashtags (i.e. #JohnDoeMemorial or #RememberingJohnDoe) can be created to commemorate a loved one's life, so friends and family can share memories, as well as pictures in an organized fashion.

Facebook has a special feature that allows you to turn a deceased loved one's profile into a memorial page, which will allow friends and family to continue to share memories and post to their page. If your loved one was a private person you can also request that their profile be permanently deleted. You can also designate someone to take control of your Facebook profile once you pass, here's a short breakdown of how to utilize these options.

If you're an immediate family member, you can request that the account be deleted instead of memorialized. To do this, use Facebook's Facebooks Special Request for Medically Incapacitated or Deceased Person's Account. You will need to provide the deceased person's full name, email address, date of death and the URL of their Timeline. You will also need to provide proof that you are an immediate family member. You can do this with a birth certificate, death certificate, or proof of authority.

If you're wanting to memorialize a Facebook page you can use the same information above to memorialize a profile. Some functions will be different once a Facebook page is memorialized.

- The word “Remembering” will be shown next to the person's name on their profile.
- Depending on the privacy settings of the account, friends can share memories on the memorialized Timeline.
- Content the person shared (ex: photos, posts) stays on Facebook and is visible to the audience it was shared with.
- Memorialized profiles don't appear in public spaces such as in suggestions for People You May Know, ads or birthday reminders.
- No one can log into a memorialized account.
- Memorialized accounts that don't have a legacy contact can't be changed.
- Pages with a sole administrator whose account was memorialized will be removed from Facebook with a valid request.

If you would like to designate someone to have control over your Facebook at the time of your passing; Go to your account Settings > Memorialization Settings> Legacy Contact. Then type in the name of the person you would like to make your Legacy Contact. You have the option to send them a message to let them know, but it's not required. Otherwise, they'll be notified when Facebook becomes aware of your passing.

Social media has proved to be a great tool in commemorating a loved one, and finding grief support from the ease and comfort of your laptop or mobile device. If you have lost someone close to you, or know someone who has, you can utilize this information to continue to share their life, and stay in contact with those who were close to them.

Nanny's Taco Soup

- 2 lb. Hamburger
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 cans Great Value stewed tomatoes
- 1 can Ro-Tel green chilies & tomatoes
- 1 can lima beans
- 1 can Great Value whole kernel corn
- 1 can Great Value pinto beans
- 1 can Great Value red kidney beans
- 2 cans Great Value white hominy
- 1 t. salt
- 1 t. pepper
- 1 oz. pkg. Old El Paso Taco Seasoning Mix
- 1 oz. pkg. dry Hidden Valley Ranch Dressing Mix
- ½ c. water

Brown hamburger and onion in large skillet.
 Drain and rinse the 3 beans, hominy and corn.
 Add to hamburger with remaining ingredients
 and simmer at least 45 minutes. The longer it
 simmers the better it gets. Top with shredded
 cheddar cheese, serve with tortilla chips or Frito
 Scoops and sour cream.
