### Lessons Learned

I joined the Owen staff 20 years ago. I am a Licensed Pastoral Counselor and provide bereavement and aftercare services to Owen families and our surrounding community. As a bereavement counselor, I am privileged to hear the "sacred story" of many people's lives. It is from these stories I share what I have learned about life.

- \* **Each day is precious** – Slow down and enjoy the people in your life. My grandfather used to say, "Genee, stop and smell the roses." I have to constantly work on this one.
- \* **Value relationships over work** – At the end of life, I have never heard anyone say they wished they would have worked more. Most people wished they'd spent more time with those they love.
- \* **Say thanks** – Remember to say thanks for the little things a spouse/family member does for you. I often hear people say they never realized how much their loved one did. It is easy to take for granted the little things people do.
- \* **Nothing's perfect but it can be really good!** - I haven't met too many people who claim they had "perfect" families, but I've met a whole lot of people who have ups and downs in their lives. I've learned families can be "messy" and still be good and loving. So, love your messy family!
- \* **Lean on God** – In the toughest of times many people express their faith in God keeps them going. Practice your faith daily so you have a strong faith to lean on when hard times come.
- \* **Don't go to bed angry** - It takes a lot of energy to hold onto anger. Let go as fast as you can, so you can get back in relationship with those you care about.
- \* **Love changes through the years** – gets deeper and more solid. – Hollywood's version of love comes up short when compared to people who have been married for decades. Love looks different on people who have been married many years -- Their love is deeper than life's circumstances; they have a love that is flexible and not flimsy; a love that is constant and sure in times of strife and trouble. The sacred stories people have shared with me have enriched my life and marriage. I reflect on their marriage journeys, and realize the trials of my marriage are normal. I have heard many say, "You have your good years and your bad years." Wow--so, if you are in a bad year hang on...it just may get better!

### From Our Kitchen To Yours

#### Tear Soup

- A pot full of tears & One heart willing to be broken open
- A dash of bitters & A bunch of good friends
- Many handfuls of comfort food
- A lot of patience & Buckets of water to replace the tears
- Plenty of exercise & A variety of helpful reading material
- Enough self care & Season with memories
- Optional: one good therapist and/or support group

#### Directions:

Choose the size pot that fits your loss. It's okay to increase pot size if you miscalculated. Combine ingredients. Set the temperature for moderate heat. Cooking times will vary depending on the ingredients needed. Strong flavors will mellow over time. Stir often. Cook no longer than you need to.

Suggestions: • Be creative • Trust your instincts • Cry when you want to, laugh when you can • Freeze some soup to use as a starter for next time • Keep your own soup-making journal so you won't forget.
