## Monday, June 23

Relax and enjoy the ride through the rolling hills of Ohio, Pennsylvania and New York before arriving in Niagara Falls, Canada, where we will spend the next four nights.

## Tuesday, June 24

This morning after breakfast we will depart with a step-on guide for a day tour that takes us back to Niagara Falls, New York for a visit to the American Falls. Here, we visit the New York State Power Vista Museum. Next, we will visit Luna Island, Cave of the Winds, Goat Island and the Three Sisters Island which offers spectacular views from the edges of the falls. After lunch we will go to the Rossi Glass Factory, the only place to manufacture Cranberry Glass in Canada. We visit the Daredevil Gallery to see the actual barrels used by Steve Trotter, Peter De Bernardi, and others who have taken the plunge over the Falls. Next, view a breathtaking film at the IMAX Theater on the history and "feats" performed at the falls. This evening we will have dinner (included) at the Skylon Tower, one of the greatest revolving restaurants.

### Wednesday, June 25

This morning after breakfast we depart for Toronto, ON. We will meet a local step on guide for a guided tour introducing us to the Financial District, Chinatown, Parliament Buildings and more. This afternoon we'll enjoy a cruise through Toronto's scenic harbor-front and Island Parklands aboard the Mariposa Cruise Liner. This evening is leisure for dinner on your own.

## Thursday, June 26

This morning after breakfast we will have a step on guide give us an exciting tour of the Canadian Falls area. Hear the roar of the falls and see the mist rising from the river as we drive around Niagara. First, we stop at the Welland Canal, for a look at this great engineering feat. The locks can lift huge ships as if they were toys. Next, we take a driving tour of Niagara-on-the-Lake; this historic town captures attention with its Georgian and Victorian-styled building, Waterfront Park and the surrounding fields of grapevines. Our next stop will be the Floral Clock and the Spanish Aerocar. We will get an exciting close-up view of this great natural wonder of thundering, churning waters as we take a boat ride on the Maid of the Mist. This evening will enjoy the award winning "Oh Canada Eh" dinner show.



To Yours

Firehouse Favorite Vegetable Soup



2 lbs ground turkey
2 cans green beans
1 can corn
1 can peas
1 large can crushed tomatoes
1 large can diced tomatoes
2 cups shredded cabbage
1 small onion chopped
1 cup celery
½ cup carrots (sliced)
2 cups cut up potatoes

Scramble and brown turkey (drain fat). Add vegetables and all ingredients in large pot.

Add seasoning 2 tsp salt (optional) 1 tsp garlic powder 1 tsp pepper 1 tsp accent

Secret Ingredient 1-2 tablespoon(s) Tones-Louisiana Cajun Spice

Simmer for 1 hour
