

## Roses' Amazing Chocolate Chip Cookies

3/4 c flour

½ c butter (1 stick)

6 T brown sugar

½ t baking soda

½ t salt

6 T sugar

½ t vanilla

1/4 t water

1 egg

1 c oats (uncooked)

1 (6) oz. chocolate morsels

Oven 375 degrees. Sift together flour, soda and salt. Blend butter, sugar, vanilla & water. Beat in egg. Add flour mixture. Mix well. Stir in oats and chocolate chips. Drop by rounded half teaspoonfuls on greased cookie sheets. Bake 10 to 12 minutes.

My Mom, Rose, has made these delicious chocolate chip cookies for me since I was a little girl. I'm carrying this tradition on with my children. I hope you will enjoy them with the ones you love.
