From Our Kitchen To Yours

Poppy Seed Chicken



5 chicken breasts (boneless)
2 cans cream of chicken soup
8 oz. sour cream

2 1/2 tubes Townhouse Crackers

2 Tbs. poppy seed

1 stick melted margarine

Cook chicken breasts and chop into bite size pieces. Mix undiluted soup and sour cream together and then add chicken. Crush crackers and then mix with poppy seeds. Add melted butter. Spray 9 x 13 inch dish with non-stick spray. Cover bottom of dish with ½ mixture of cracker mixture. Add layer of chicken mixture and then top with rest of cracker mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until it bubbles.
