Our American Flag



The flag folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our country was originally founded. The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing the state our veterans served in uniform. The canton field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted when draped as a pall on a casket of a veteran who has served our country in uniform.

The 1st fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The 2nd fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The 3rd fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing our ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The 4th fold represents our weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to God we turn in times of peace as well as in times of war for God's divine guidance.

The 5th fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The 6th fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our hearts that, "We pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

The 7th fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they are found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The 8th fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day.

The 9th fold is a tribute to womanhood and mothers. For it has been through their faith, their love, loyalty and devotion that the character of

the men and women who have made this country great has been molded.

The 10th fold is a tribute to the fathers, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

The 11th fold, in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The 12th fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding us of our nation's motto, "In God We Trust."

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat. This reminds us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades, and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States. These brave men and women preserved for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.

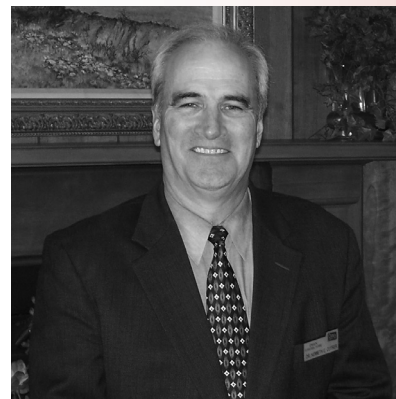

Ken's Favorite Chocolate "D"



One whole angelfood cake, broken
into bite-sized pieces
12 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips
4 eggs
4 tbs. sugar
1 pt. whipping cream (16 oz.)

Put 1/2 of the angel food cake
into a 2 quart casserole dish. Melt
the chocolate chips in microwave
and place in large bowl. Add 4
beaten egg yolks to 4 beaten egg
whites and add 4 tbs. of sugar
- this should be the texture of me-
ringue. Add this to the chocolate.
Whip the cream and add chocolate
mixture to it. Pour 1/2 of this mix-
ture on to the angelfood cake. Add
the rest of the angelfood cake and
pour on the rest of the chocolate.
Chill several hours and then enjoy!
